And while you're out cruising, try this recipe from member Janet Wilson of WaveHopper

Gingerlime Butter

- 6 T unsalted butter, softened
- 2 T chopped chives
- 1 juice of 2 limes
- 2 t grated lime rind
- 1 t grated fresh ginger
- 1/2 t chopped fresh thyme leaves, or 1/4 t dried thyme
- 1 coarse salt and freshly
- 1 ground black pepper

Instructions

Using an electric beater, if available, and a warm bowl, beat the butter for a couple of minutes to make it fluffy.


Gradually add the chives, lime juice, lime rind, ginger, and thyme. Season with salt and pepper and mix well.

Form the butter into a ball, wrap it in aluminium foil, and refrigerate. Use the freezer compartment if you are making the butter within 2 hours of serving the fish, so that the butter is not too soft.

Cut the butter in neat, even slices and place them on broiled fish steaks. Garnish with parsley and serve.

Yield: 4 servings.

(Note: Make ahead and take along!!)


