Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal Winner: Norm Dyck

Not just everyone is awarded the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal.

Fraser Squadron is very proud and fortunate to declare that local MP John Cummins presented Mr. John Norman Dyck with the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal. Many Fraser Squadron members will recognize Norm as he completed the Boating course in 1976 and subsequently joined Fraser Squadron, serving Fraser Squadron as Training Officer, Executive Officer, and as Squadron Commander in 1980.

Norm authored "Fraser's Guide to Radio Operation" in 1977, which subsequently become an official radio publication of the federal Dept. of Communications. Norm served Pacific Mainland District as District Training Officer, Executive Officer, and as 1984's District Commander.


His work at the national CPS level included time as a Course Director-Instructor Training, General Director of the Governing Board, National Administrative Officer, and Executive Officer. Norm was elected to Chief Commander and served in this capacity from 1991 to 1993.

Additionally Norm authored the Canadian section of Chapman's *Piloting, 61st edition* and was awarded Life Membership in Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons in 1993. Norm served as the CPS representative to the Canadian Safe Boating Council, National Safe Boating Council and National Association of Boating Law Administrators for a number of years. Since 1995, Norm has been Government Liaison Officer for Pacific Mainland District.

A consummate volunteer, Norm currently works with *Council of British Columbia Yacht Clubs* (CBCYC) where he served for a year as Vice President and a number of years as a delegate and was elected President of the Council in 1997. The mandate of this council, which represents more than 50 yacht clubs in British Columbia, is to improve relationships between clubs, to monitor legislation and to advance the best interests of recreational boaters in British Columbia. Norm completed four years as president in November 2001 and now serves as Government Liaison officer.

It is this latest work with CBCYC which will impact boaters now and for the future. As boaters we can be relieved to know Norm is on our side, promoting boating and privileged use of Marine Parks. During five decades of service and volunteer work it is estimated that Norm has committed time to nearly twenty organizations. Norm's volunteer work is only surpassed by his devotion to family and friends.
