Boating in Washington State

Further to a previous article about licensing / registration requirements, if you are boating in the USA please note:

- 2. There may be confusion between Canadian and U.S. terms: our Canadian licensing can be compared to U.S. registration. Licensing is the most commom method used for Canadian pleasure boat identification. Canadian registration is similar to U.S. documentation and is usually reserved for large and commercial vessels.
- 3. Remember you need to carry charts for the area that you cruise in, e.g. the san Juan Islands, as well as the relevant Coast Pilot. This link finds you digital versions of the free U.S. charts in either raster or vector format:

4. U.S. vessels 26 feet or more in length must display a placard to make those on board aware of the garbage regulations. U.S. vessels 40 feet or larger, and which operate beyond three miles, and have a galley and berthing, or engage in commerce, must have a waste management plan posted and keep records of garbage discharges and disposals. Recipe Corner - Mom's No-fail Pie Crust

Sift together 5 cups of flour: 1 tsp. salt; 2 tsp. baking powder. Cut in 1 pound Crisco.

Break egg into a measuring cup, add 1 tbsp. of vinegar, then fill cup with cold water, mix three together and add to flour and crisco mixture. Do not over mix.

Form into a large ball and cut into 5 equal pieces. Wrap and freeze.
