USA Chart Booklets - Free Download

The NOAA Booklet Chart is a product you can download for free. These are USA charts in booklet form.

http://www.nauticalcharts.noaa.gov/staff/BookletChart.html

You can store this PDF on your tablet, laptop, etc, or print the charts at home. On your laptop or tablet these charts are not electronic charting, ie they do not show your vessel location on the chart, but they can be thought of as carrying a backup and more up-to-date electronic copy of your paper charts (always carry paper charts for the area you are navigating in).

The charts in the booklet are reduced in scale and divided into pages for convenience but the charts contain all the information found on full-size charts. On your laptop or tables you can zoom in to expand the view of the chart.

The bar scales on the charts are also reduced in scale but are accurate when measuring distances on the charts. Excerpts from the US Coast Pilot are included and the charts are updated every week with Notices to Mariners.





Expansion of Gulf Island National Park Reserve

Gulf Islands National Park Reserve is expanding with new protected lands on Pender, Saturna and Prevost islands! The new properties are a mix of waterfront and forested areas, including over 2,700 metres of beaches. This expansion will lead to the development of new hiking trails, swimming areas, picnic sites, and walk-in or boat-in camping for visitors.

The growth of Gulf Islands National Park Reserve will also ensure that more of Canada's rare Garry oak ecosystem is protected. The extensive shorelines provide habitat for a variety of wildlife. The forested areas have a mixture of arbutus and Douglas fir, including some old-growth cedar. The new lands also include a wetland considered prime habitat for the endangered sharp-tailed snake.

Roesland Extension - North Pender Island

This waterfront property is surrounded by existing Gulf Islands National Park Reserve lands and extends the park's popular Roesland site. It includes 455 metres of waterfront, including sandy and pebbles beaches, rocky coastal bluffs and protected coves with sunset views.

Shingle Bay - North Pender Island

Sitting below Roe Lake, this seaside property connects to existing Gulf Islands National Park Reserve lands and includes over 335 metres of waterfront. The area includes a beach with views of Captain Passage and nearby islets, a small waterfall, wetland, creek and manmade pond.

Culturally, this property hosts the remnants of the Shingle Bay fish reduction plant that operated intermittently between 1927 and 1959. The plant produced oil and fertilizer from fish remains towed in from coastal canneries. It served as an important part of the local economy, employing 15 to 20 men at a time, mainly Pender Island residents. It was supported by the store and gas service at Roesland.

Maple Bay - Prevost Island

This extensive waterfront property connects two existing areas of Gulf Islands National Park Reserve: the Bright Islets and the park's serene beach at Portlock Point. The property has over 2,000 metres of waterfront with a large pebble beach. It includes Douglas fir forests, meadows and rocky ridges of up to 60 metres, which provide scenic lookouts above the water.

Saturna Island Extension

Surrounded on two sides by existing Gulf Islands National Park Reserve lands, this wooded landscape provides spectacular views of Plumper Sound.

The List of Lights (LL) publications are divided by sectors then areas. The LL on the NOTMAR Web site are up to date with the latest Monthly corrections.

Radio Aids To Marine Navigation Annual Publications Online - Free!

Effective April 1st, 2013, the Canadian Coast Guard will **cease** the printing of its "Radio Aids to Marine Navigation" annual publications which include the "Atlantic, St. Lawrence, Great Lakes, Lake Winnipeg and Eastern Arctic" volume as well as the "Pacific and Western Arctic" volume.

The publications will continue to be available online, free of charge, at: http://www.ccggcc.gc.ca/eng/CCG/Information_for_Mariners.

The "Radio Aids to Marine Navigation" annual publications are updated each April. Amendments will continue to be advertised by radio broadcast (Notices to Shipping) and/or issued on a monthly basis, when required, in "Notices to Mariners", Section 3. The "Notices to Mariners" publication is available online, free of charge, at: http://www.notmar.gc.ca.

Every ship station fitted on a Canadian ship or on a non-Canadian ship engaged in the coasting trade of Canada, pursuant to the Ship Station (Radio) Regulations 1999,and all ships in waters under Canadian Jurisdiction, pursuant to the Charts and Nautical Publications Regulations, 1995, are required to carry the most recent applicable edition of "Radio Aids to Marine Navigation".

Notice Regarding Overlap of Electronic Navigation Charts (ENC)

Pacific - Juan de Fuca Strait

To comply with internationally agreed practices, Canada and the United States of America have agreed to eliminate overlapping coverage of Electronic Navigation Charts (ENCs). The first area where these changes will take affect are Juan de Fuca Strait, Haro Strait and Boundary Pass. This new ENC coverage scheme will result in each country changing their areas of coverage, so that only one country's ENC would be available for any given area at a particular scale.

These changes came into effect 0000 Coordinated Universal Time (UTC), on 15 December, 2011.

The following represents the ENCs that are affected by this project:

Exciting Happenings in Victoria

It was our first trip around the bottom of Vancouver Island into the Strait of Juan de Fuca and on to Victoria harbour. As it turned out however there was absolutely no problem and we cruised easily into Victoria harbour avoiding seaplanes and all other manner of obstacles.

Then there it was, the coveted spot at the public dock right in front of the world famous Empress Hotel. It was a lovely summer evening and after a walk into town and dinner on the boat we settled down to watch the entertainment on the foreshore walk. There were artists, sidewalk stalls and performers of every description as well as just the ordinary people walking by. It kept us busy for hours.

All of a sudden our attention was focused on a group of people who were excitedly peering down into the water as it lapped against the brick walkway. The tide had come in and the water is several feet deep at the shore. We were fascinated as several young people arrived and discussed and pointed down into the water in an animated fashion. Finally after much discussion one of the young men was lowered into the water, dove down and came up with the prize. A set of car keys! All of this free of charge.

As it began to get dark the sidewalk sellers and entertainers packed up and left for the evening to be replaced by strollers and the people of the night. Kouka and I went below and went bed where I fell into a sound sleep right away only to be woken up, in what seemed to be only a few minutes, by Kouka shaking me awake in an agitated fashion.

"Peter, someone is on the boat!" "What, are you sure? I don't feel anything."

But knowing that a happy wife is a happy life I decided to get up and have a look. I opened the hatch and stuck my head out. There was no one on our boat but I could see a street person climbing onto the boat moored in front of us.

"I yelled in my very quiet voice, "Hey what the hell are you doing?" or words to that effect! The guy, not expecting to be caught must have had a near heart attack and immediately jumped off the boat ran down the dock and up the ramp. I decided to follow him at a discrete distance just to see who he was. In few minutes it became obvious to me that he was a street person who was not in full control of all his faculties.

I went back to bed and fell sound asleep. I was much younger then!

The next morning, not too early, we were woken up by much excitement on the dock and policemen all over the place. It turns out that our visitor from the night before had returned, stolen a dinghy and some fishing gear from another boat. He had been arrested paddling around in circles in the middle of James Bay. I approached the police and gave them a statement about what I had seen.

I was called several months later by the crown prosecutor from Victoria and asked if I would appear in court at a later date which I agreed to do. At least eight months later a court date was set and I made plans to make the trip to the capital. The day before the court date I was called as the man had disappeared and the whole thing was cancelled.

Never let it be said that boating on the West coast is not filled with kinds of excitement!
