Recipe Corner

Kalamata Olive Spread from "Chardonnay"

1 (6 ounce) jar pitted kalamata olives, drained

- 1 (8 ounce) container sour cream
- 1 tablespoon dried dill
- 2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese, softened
- 4 ounces fet cheese, crumbled

Combine olives, sour cream and dill in a food processor: pulse until well blended. Add cream cheese and feta; pulse until creamy. Serve with pita bread. Yield: about 3 cups.
